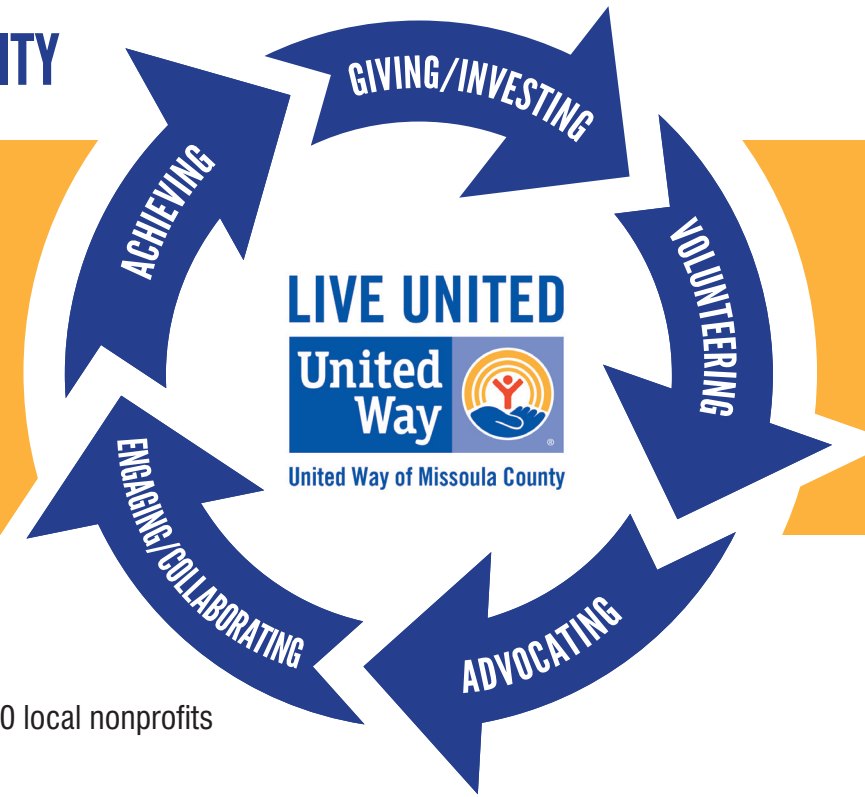

EDUCATION

Graduation Matters Missoula

Supporting efforts in and out of school to help kids succeed. Missoula County Public Schools has the highest graduation rate (89.5%) and lowest dropout rate (2.6%) among large districts in Montana.

Imagination Library

1,800 enrolled children, age 0-5 in Missoula and Mineral counties receive a free book each month, opening their eyes to the world of learning before they start kindergarten.

Supply Our Students

United Way volunteers stuffed 450 backpacks full of school supplies for elementary, middle and high school students in need.

INCOME

Reaching Home: Missoula's 10-Year Plan to End Homelessness

Working with a broad coalition of stakeholders to end homelessness. In 2014, at least 230 homeless people housed • single point-of-entry-system created for people homeless or on verge of homelessness • community conversation begun about permanent supported housing

HEALTH

Let's Move! Missoula

Putting Missoula children and families on a healthier path. • LM!M hosted free summit on improving food in school and child care facilities for 200 educators, child care providers, health professionals, nonprofit organizations and students • worked with child care providers to improve nutrition and physical activity for kids in their care • identified/began addressing barriers to physical activity in elementary, middle and high schools • continued surveying rates of overweight/obesity in Missoula schools • worked with Community Medical Center to start a "Prescription Trails" program • with a grant from Providence St. Patrick Hospital, provided fun, interactive "Sqord" monitors for 5th Grade students to help them monitor physical activity.

Western Montana Suicide Prevention Initiative

Bringing together the public and private sector – veterans groups, nonprofits, businesses, and schools – to stem the tide of suicide in our community. WMPSI: • hosted free summit that trained more than 220 attendees in effective suicide prevention and intervention, and related areas (media guidelines; self-care; resilience; support for those grieving a death by suicide) • crafted plan to broaden public awareness and increase access to suicide-prevention training
